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2025 Advocacy Package for Museums

Dear Valued Members,

ANSM continues the important work of advocating for museums at all levels of government. This year, we would like to encourage you to get involved by inviting elected officials to your museum and/or requesting stakeholder meetings with them. We understand the vital role that museums play in our communities, and we need elected officials to understand this too. It is essential to advocate for funding and political support to ensure that our institutions continue to thrive.

Governments often make decisions that directly impact our institutions, so it's crucial to build strong relationships with all levels of elected officials - local, provincial, and federal. By inviting elected officials to your museum or meeting with them at their offices, you can show off what your museum accomplishes and the value it brings to your community. Elected officials value how museums contribute to community economics, culture, and services so don't forget to mention the role your museum plays in these areas.

To help you with this important advocacy project ANSM has prepared some resources to help you make the most of the visit. If you have any questions, or require any support, please reach out. We're happy to help you advocate for your museum.

This package is ready for you to put your personal stamp on. Use the templates provided to invite politicians to your site and share with them the impact you have on education, culture, economics, and social well-being.

Steps to follow to get politicians to your fantastic site!

1. Reach out (Includes additional postcard option)

Since elected officials are generally not in their offices over the summer, start by sending them an email. If you can find the time later this summer or in the fall, assuming your location is open, contact them by mail. Try grabbing a postcard from your gift shop (or purchase/create one), find a stamp, and use the template provided to tailor the invite to suit your museum. By

2. Haven't heard back from them?

Follow up. It never hurts to send a friendly reminder. Try giving them a call and invite them again. Maybe you have an upcoming event that highlights the best of your museum? Provide all the information and let them know that you look forward to seeing them soon!

3. They've accepted your invite, now what?

Talk to them and let them know what your museum is all about. Give them a tour of your facility and let them know where the funding is going. Thank them for the recent budget increase, but also let them know how more funding will benefit your location and why continued funding is so important and who is positively impacted by it.

Take a moment to review some of the *Reconsidering Museums* fact sheets (https://reconsideringmuseums.ca/informational-tools/). These will give you some great talking points and they are included in the package that you can give to your elected official.

4. During their visit

Provide photo opportunities, especially with summer students and volunteers. Give them good content to use for their newsletters and social media. Post photos and tag them on your social media outlets. This is an easy post for you and it will definitely make them happy!

Be sure to provide your politician with a hard copy of the attached package. This will help reiterate what you've talked about and can even assist them when speaking to other government or community leaders.

You did it! Give yourself and your team a well deserved pat on the back for taking a positive step towards advocating for your location!

Be sure to send your politician a thank you note for visiting. A thank you template is included for you to use.
